

Genders and ages of the August 2007 primary voters:

- Women between the ages of 18 and 34 voted in the primary at rates significantly higher than their male counterparts.

The differences decreased until the 65 and older group, in which women voted at rates slightly lower than their representation in the population.

- Young people between the ages of 18 and 24 constituted 8.1% of our registered voters in August, but turned in only 3% of the primary vote.
- Voters aged 45 and older cast 80.5% of the primary vote (the percentage in the 2006 general election was about 75%).
