


### How to vote

Vote for one in each race. If you vote for more than one, no votes will be counted for that race.


### If you make a mistake

**Initiative Measure No. 1351**

**Initiative Measure No. 591**

**Engrossed Substitute House Bill 1287**

The Asotin County Public Transportation Benefit Area governing body passed Resolution No. 14-04 proposing to continue a sales and use tax of two-tenths (2/10ths) of one per cent (1%) within Asotin County, beginning on January 1, 2015 to continue funding for the Asotin County Public Transportation Benefit Area. The revenue will be solely for the purpose of funding the operation, maintenance and capital needs of the public transportation system for Asotin County.

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

Emergency Medical Services Excess Tax Levy  
The City Council of the City of Clarkston, Washington, adopted Resolution No. 2014-12 concerning a proposition to finance emergency medical services. This proposition, if approved, would permit maintenance and operation of Rescue One Emergency Medical Services through the levy of a special excess tax for collection in 2015 of \$546,167.00 requiring approximately \$1.33 per thousand dollars of assessed value (based on 100% of true and fair value).
