Chelan County is now a Vote-by-Mail County. This means every registered voter will receive a ballot in the mail. The only polling place will be located in the Auditor's Office at the courthouse.

Those who choose not to vote their mail ballot may come into the Auditor's Office to use the accessible eSlate voting machine. The accessible voting machine will be available starting October 18th during regular office hours and from 7a.m. to 8p.m. on Election Day, November 7th. Identification is required.

For voters who vote their paper ballot, you should take one of the following actions:

1. Mail your ballot using sufficient first-class postage. Make sure it will be postmarked no later than Election Day.
