For Chelan County, State of Washington
TUESDAY, February 19, 2008

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on Tuesday, February 19, 2008, there will be a Presidential Primary and Special Election. The Presidential Primary is a county-wide election. Voters will be provided a Democratic party ballot and a Republican party ballot. A third ballot may be included if you live within the following jurisdictions: Entiat School District, Lake Chelan School District, Pateros School District, Fire District No. 8 or Manson Park & Recreation that lists the nonpartisan ballot measures only. Each party ballot lists the candidates of that party running for partisan office as well as nonpartisan ballot measures. The "Nonpartisan Measures" ballot only lists the nonpartisan ballot measures, and does not list any partisan offices.

Washington State's Presidential Primary

The Presidential Primary is a unique election that happens once every four years. The reason for the primary is to assist the major political parties in selecting delegates to their national conventions and to encourage candidates for President to visit our state. There are special rules made for this election to help us fulfill its purpose. Below are some rules that apply specifically to this election.

1. The voter must choose to vote Democratic or Republican by checking one party oath and signing on the envelope before the vote can be counted.
2. The political party the voter chooses becomes public information.
3. The State Republican Party has decided it will use the State Primary to allocate 51% of its delegates; the State Democratic Party will use 0%.
4. Voters can participate in a party caucus and the Presidential Primary as long as they participate on behalf of the same party. The caucuses were held February 9th. Please contact the party for further caucus information.

This proposition would authorize the District to acquire land for a future school site, renovate Community Gym and Lake Chelan High/Middle School, and make safety and health improvements to Morgen Owings Elementary School; issue no more than \$5,500,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 6 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 07-02. This means every registered voter will receive a ballot in the mail. The only polling place will be located in the Auditor's Office at the courthouse. Those who choose not to vote their mail ballot may come into the Auditor's Office to use the accessible eSlate voting machine. The accessible voting machine will be available starting January 30th during regular office hours and from 7a.m. to 8p.m. on Election Day, February 19th. Identification is required. For voters who vote their paper ballot, you should take one of the following actions: 1. Mail your ballot using sufficient first-class postage. Make sure it will be postmarked no later than Election Day. 2.
