

## **NOTICE OF GENERAL ELECTION**

Clallam County, State of Washington  
**November 7, 2017**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to the qualified voters of Clallam County, State of Washington, that on November 7, 2017, there will be held a General Election, conducted all by mail. The purpose of this election is to approve or to reject State Advisory Votes, a County Measure, and Local Propositions, and to elect officials to various Port, Hospital, City, School, Fire, Parks and Recreation, and Water offices. Local candidates will appear only on the ballots within the special districts calling for such elections.

### **Voter Registration Deadlines for a person not registered in Washington state:**

**October 9, 2017**

(Twenty-nine days before the election)

**Last day to submit a voter registration:**

- ◆ **Online**
- ◆ **By mail** - registration forms must be postmarked by this date

**October 30, 2017**

(Eight days before the election)

**Last day to register in person:**

- ◆ **At the Clallam County Auditor's Office**

### **Voter Registration Deadlines for a person currently registered in Washington state:**

**October 9, 2017**

(Twenty-nine days before the election)

**Last day to submit voter registration changes:**

- ◆ **Online**
- ◆ **By mail** - registration forms must be postmarked by this date
- ◆ **At the Clallam County Auditor's Office**

A registered voter who fails to transfer his or her residential address by this deadline may vote according to his/her previous registration address.

**Advisory Vote No. 16**

**Engrossed Substitute House Bill 1597**

The legislature increased, without a vote of the people, the food fish excise tax rate on certain salmon and game fish, costing less than \$1,000,000 in the first ten years, for government spending.

**Advisory Vote No. 17**

**Engrossed House Bill 2163**

The legislature expanded, without a vote of the people, the business and occupation tax and narrowed certain retail sales and use tax exemptions, costing \$565,000,000 in the first ten years, for government spending.

**Advisory Vote No. 18**

**Engrossed House Bill 2242**

The legislature imposed, without a vote of the people, an additional state property tax for common schools, costing \$12,949,000,000 in the first ten years, for government spending.

Ballots for this election will be mailed to all qualified voters on October 18. Returned ballots must be postmarked or placed in a ballot drop box by November 7.

- Postage is required on all ballots returned by mail. If you are mailing your ballot on Election Day, be sure to check the postmark cut off time at your Post Office. Ballots bearing postmarks after November 7 will be considered late, and cannot be counted.
- All drop boxes are available 24 hours a day. On Election Day ballots will be accepted in the drop boxes until 8:00 p.m. Drop boxes are located at the following sites:
  - ◆ **Sequim Village Shopping Center**, in the JCPenney’s parking lot, Sequim, WA
  - ◆ **Forks City Hall**, 500 E. Division St., Forks, WA
  - ◆ **Clallam County Courthouse**, 223 E. 4th St., Port Angeles, WA  
(In the circular drive and on the sidewalk across from disabled parking)
  - ◆ Additional drop boxes may be installed in Clallam County in 2017. Click on “Ballot Drop Box Information” at [www.clallam.net/elections](http://www.clallam.net/elections) for the most up-to-date list.
- Accessible voting equipment is available at the Clallam County Auditor’s Office in the Courthouse. The Accessible Voting Unit will be available from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. weekdays, beginning October 18 and ending at 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, November 7. The voting equipment is available to any voter wishing to use it, but the equipment has special features to allow voters with disabilities to use it independently.
