Public Utility District 1, Commissioner District 3 (Nonpartisan office)	2	Nonpartisan office skips the Primary because fewer than 3 candidates filed. RCW 29A.52.231 (If 3 or more candidates had filed, then the Commissioner District 3 sub-district would vote first in the Primary before the office advanced to the General election where the entire PUD district would then vote.)	Entire PUD District 1 votes. Candidate names will be in order by Lot Draw results: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jim Waddell • Ted Simpson
Precinct Committee Officers	Varies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If 2 or more candidates filed, they will appear in the Primary. Candidate names will be in order by Lot Draw results. The candidate with the most votes in the primary is elected. • If only 1 candidate filed, the candidate is considered elected and skips the primary. • If no one filed, the newly selected Party Chair may fill the empty position through appointment (see RCW 29A.80.031). The Party office is responsible for maintaining their list of appointed PCOs. <p>The term of office for PCOs begins December 1, 2018 and last 2 years.</p> <p>See the Clearinghouse on Precinct Officer Elections for more information.</p>	PCOs do not appear in the General Election.
