


Use blue or black ink pen.

6 Year Permanent EMS Levy Lid Increase

Cowlitz County-Lewis County Fire Protection District 20 shall be authorized to permanently increase its regular property tax levy for emergency medical care and services up to \$.50 per \$1000 of assessed valuation for collection in 2016, to set a 106% limit factor for each of the five succeeding years, and to provide that the maximum allowable levy in 2021 shall be used to determine future increases as allowed by Chapter 84.55 RCW.
