
### How to vote

**Fire Protection District No. 6**  
Proposition 1

Proposition Authorizing Increase of Previous Property Tax Levies

The Board of Commissioners of Cowlitz County Fire Protection District No. 6 adopted Resolution No. 2016-0421 concerning a proposition to improve fire and emergency services. This proposition authorizes the District to increase its regular property tax levy from \$0.42 to \$1.20 per thousand of assessed value for collection in 2017 and authorizes a limit factor of 106% for each of the five succeeding years. The funds will allow the District to maintain apparatus and equipment and hire paid firefighters to supplement its current volunteer staffing.
