

**NOTICE OF GENERAL ELECTION
FERRY COUNTY, WASHINGTON
TUESDAY, November 4, 2014**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a General Election will be held in the State of Washington, County of Ferry, on Tuesday, the 4th day of November 2014. That in compliance with the provisions of R.C.W. 29A.08.140, Voter Registration books will be closed to original registrations and transfers from October 6, 2014 through November 4, 2014, both dates inclusive, for the purpose of holding the General Election on November 4, 2014. The amendment to R.C.W. 29A.08.140, states after the closing of the Voters Registration books, you may still register to vote **AT THE AUDITOR'S OFFICE ONLY** until 4:00 PM, October 27, 2014 (for new registrations only). Transfer with in Washington must be completed 30 days before the Election Day. Registration is possible at all times, but each qualified elector **must be registered at least 8 days before voting.** In such instance, the record will be placed in suspense by the registration officer concerned until after the General Election has been held. Registration books will be reopened after the General Election held on November 4, 2014. Following is a complete list of candidates to appear on the official ballots for Ferry County with the candidate's mailing address and phone number. The entire county will be vote by mail. Please make sure your ballot is postmarked or returned to the Auditors Office no later than November 4, 2014.
