Dear Voter,

In my new role as Auditor I implemented a full review of the cost and efficiencies of the election process with a willingness to make changes if the benefits were clearly recognized and met our desired goals of integrity, transparency, security and efficiency. To that end, we are introducing a number of changes to further those goals.

Simplified balloting materials

The materials were simplified by removing redundant information printed on the materials and elimination of a signature flap that was put in place by state law. That law was subsequently repealed.

Security cameras

Security cameras were installed in the elections facility. They provide two functions: security by recording the activities in the facility and transparency by allowing visitors to view the elections process from the public view area via a monitor.

Improved transparency through web viewing

A web camera was added that will be utilized when there is work being completed in our ballot tabulating area. This will allow the public to view activity live via the Internet.

Redesigned website

Our Auditor’s webpage has been reviewed and improved utilizing a user friendly design.

Submitted by Franklin County County and Cities' Criminal Justice and Public Safety Tax

The Board of Franklin County Commissioners adopted Resolution No. 2011-281, concerning a proposition for a county and cities' criminal justice sales and use tax. This proposition would authorize the sales and use tax in Franklin County and cities therein be increased three-tenths of one percent (0.003) for thirty years to improve public safety, including criminal gang suppression, and to expand, operate, and maintain the County jail, Pasco Municipal Courts, and the Pasco Police Department, and in support of other criminal justice and public safety purposes. Explanatory Statement

If enacted, this Proposition imposes a countywide sales/use tax of three-tenths of one percent (0.003). By law revenue from this tax distributes sixty percent to the County and forty percent per capita to the Cities therein. This revenue may only be used for purposes described in the Proposition. Those purposes include criminal gang suppression; expansion, operation, and maintenance of the County jail, Pasco Municipal Courts, and Pasco Police Department; and for other criminal justice and public safety purposes. Exempt from said tax are motor vehicle retail sales/use, and leases of such up to the first thirty-six months.

Statement For Proposition No. 1

The City of Pasco along with Franklin County has experienced over 50% growth in population during the past 10 years bringing our new total to well over 80,000 residents.

Few things are more important to enabling and maintaining the quality of life that we enjoy here in the City and in the County than keeping crime low and keeping criminals locked up. Our home values, our ability to attract and retain business, and the freedom to move about our communities and enjoy their many attractions without fear or worry are all based on maintaining an environment that keeps crime low and keeps criminals off of our streets.

Last expanded in the late 1980s, when our population was less than half what it is today, our current law and justice center facility is designed to hold approximately a 100 inmates, but the facility now routinely holds over 200. Soon our Sheriff will be forced to release criminals who should be in jail for their crimes. Our court rooms and processing areas are over full and must have additional space to continue to process and hear cases safely and efficiently.

This over-due expansion of our law and justice center will provide the necessary space to continue to keep criminals off of our streets and provide safe and secure court rooms and processing areas.

Please join the Franklin County Commissioners, Pasco City Council, and Citizens for a Safe City of Pasco who urge us all to vote "YES" for the Franklin County Law and Justice Center Expansion. Please vote "YES" so we can maintain our quality of life!

Levy for Parks and Recreation
Operations and Capital Improvements**

The City of Connell Council adopted Ordinance No. 907 asking voters to increase property taxes to finance parks and recreation operations and facility improvements. This proposition would increase the City's regular property tax levy by \$0.40 per \$1,000 over the current levy of assessed valuation for collection beginning in 2012 and use the 2012 levy amount to recalculate subsequent levy limits. Explanatory Statement

The Connell City Council adopted Ordinance No. 907 placing a proposition on the November 8, 2011 ballot asking voters to consider an increase in the regular property tax levy by \$0.40 per \$1,000 in assessed value for collection beginning in 2012. The additional tax revenue, estimated to be approximately \$54,000, may only be used for parks and recreation operations, maintenance, and capital improvements within the City. The 2012 levy amount will be used to calculate subsequent levy limits.

Statement For Proposition No. 1

Pool and parks are always on the chopping block!

The position of the Parks & Recreation Director has been eliminated, pool hours reduced, and pool usage fees increased. The Connell Community Center and the Connell Heritage Museum operate under the parks budget. The City of Connell has already raised facility use fees for the Community Center. Repair of picnic shelters and playground equipment and grounds maintenance has been delayed.

Pioneer Park Pool is at danger of closing. Council discussed this last fall when planning the 2011 budget. If the pool closes we will lose an invaluable asset in our community.

No water safety training. Learning to swim is the first most important thing we can do to prevent drowning. Water safety is an absolute necessity in our community.

No swim team for our kids to keep them active during the summer. Each summer the team enrolls between 50-60 kids. These kids get a minimum of 7 1/2 hours of lung pumping exercise each week.

No lifeguard jobs for our teenagers. The pool employs 10-12 lifeguards each summer who save money for a car, college or a mission.

Without a pool our kids will spend more time in front of the computer at a time when we need the generation to be more active.

How much more can we take away from the valuable resources and quality of life in our community?

Support of this measure will provide a reliable revenue source for our pool and parks.

My lead in broadcasting city council and planning commission meetings has matured in to the city system that can now be accessed online as well as TV.




Pasco has also become even more open on my watch. City meetings are professionally televised, available on the Internet, and meeting materials available for easy review.






