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A Message to the Voters of Franklin County

This sample ballot is provided by the County Auditor to assist you in understanding in advance of election day what will be on the ballot that you will vote in the voting booth.

Information included is:

- Your name and address as recorded on the Voters Registry. If there is any question relative to your registration as shown, call us before election day at 545-3538.
- Your respective polling place and location is printed above your name on the address label.
- The date and voting hours for election day.
- Instructions on use of the Datavote voting system, used by Franklin County (see below).
- A facsimile of the respective ballot that you will vote on election day – a "sample ballot."

As you open this sample ballot, you will see a facsimile of the ballot which you will receive and vote at your polling place.

You are entitled to vote for all offices (contests printed on your ballot. For each contest the ballot indicates the number of choices you may vote in that contest – for example, "Vote for One," or "Vote for Three." Do not vote for more candidates than the number indicates in each contest.

Many voters have found it helpful to bring this sample ballot to the polling place with them, having marked their choices at their leisure at home, and then use the sample ballot as a guide in voting their official ballot in the voting booth.

Do *not* use this sample ballot as an absentee ballot.

Please let us know any suggestions you may have for improving the voting process – we strive to give the very best service possible to Franklin County voters.

If you have any questions at the polling place, go to the Voter Assistance table and ask for help.



VOTER INSTRUCTIONS

**VOTE ONE BALLOT CARD AT A TIME
VOTE BOTH SIDES OF EACH BALLOT CARD**



From the left side of the punching device, place the ballot card under the plastic shield. The card must lie completely flat within the holding tray of the punching device. Gently hold the card in to the right as far as it will go for the punch to actuate.





Slide the punching arm to the candidate or issue of your choice in the first contest. The red arrow on the punching arm should be lined up with the dot on the ballot card which indicates the voting position for your choice in that contest.





Firmly depress the punching lever and release to record your vote. Move the punching lever to the voting position of your candidate in the next contest and repeat the punching process. When you have completed voting the ballot card face, turn it over. Re-insert the card and vote all contests.

When you have voted both sides of all ballot cards, place the cards in the black ballot holder with stub ends sticking out at the top. Deliver the ballot holder containing the cards to the ballot box officials.



WRITE-IN VOTE (General Election Only)
Write the name of your candidate in the blank space provided in the contest and punch that voting position.

OVERVOTE
Do **NOT** vote for more than the number of candidates to be elected in each contest.

DAMAGED BALLOT
If you make an error or damage any ballot card, punch out all voting positions as far as you have voted. Then return all ballots to the chief judges at the voter assistance table. Replacement ballot cards will be issued to you.
