

This proposition would authorize the District to: renovate and expand Warden Elementary School (including reconfiguring the existing gymnasium into classrooms and a performing arts area, modernizing entire building and constructing a classroom addition) and construct a District-wide gymnasium/multipurpose addition to the Warden High School Gymnasium; issue no more than \$9,311,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 07-14-15.
