
**How to vote**

**Proposed Hospital District 2  
Election for the Establishment of GHC  
Public Hospital District 2**  
  
Shall Grays Harbor County Public Hospital District No. 2 be formed to encompass all of the area of Grays Harbor County, excluding voting precincts already part of Hospital District No. 1 and Oakville voting precincts 064, 066, 068 and 701, which outer boundaries follow specific legal description noted in Grays Harbor County Board of Commissioners Resolution No. 2014-052.

**City of McCleary  
Prop. No. 1**  
**Levy to Partially Fund Police Services**  
  
If approved, this proposition shall aid in restoring adequate funding for the operations of the Police Department. Shall the City of McCleary be authorized to collect in 2015 only a total of \$110,000.00 in excess property taxes at \$1.14 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation or such rate as may be established by the County Assessor as necessary to generate this amount for the purpose of more adequately funding the operations and maintenance of its Police Department?

**City of McCleary  
Prop. No. 2**  
**Levy Lift to Complete Restoration of Funding of Police Services**  
  
The City of McCleary adopted Resolution No. 670 concerning a proposition to fully restore adequate funding for Police Department operations by increasing the regular property tax levy rate. This proposition would allow an increase of the levy rate for property taxes received by the City to be increased to \$3.18 per thousand dollars of assessed value, with the actual rate established by the Assessor, for collection in 2015 and authorize annual increases in the levy amount for each of the five succeeding years by the limit factor or the greater of one percent or the percentage change from the June to June "Seattle/Tacoma/Bremerton consumer price index (CPI-U), with the 2020 levy rate used to calculate subsequent levy limits and rates.

**City of Ocean Shores  
Prop. No.1**  
**Replacement Levy to Support Ocean Shores Public Library**  
  
The City Council of the City of Ocean Shores adopted Resolution No. 710 concerning property taxes to support the City library. This proposition would permit the City to increase its regular property tax levy by \$0.277 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation to replace a \$0.247 per \$1,000 expiring library levy lid lift, resulting in a regular property tax levy of not-to-exceed \$3.221 per \$1,000 for collection in 2015. This levy amount would also be used to compute the City's levy limits for 2016 and 2017 as allowed by Chapter 84.55 RCW.

**Emergency Medical Services 6-year Levy**  
  
The Board of Fire Commissioners of  
Grays Harbor County Fire Protection  
District No. 11 (the "District") adopted  
Resolution No.2014-03 concerning a  
proposition to finance maintenance and  
operation expenses. This proposition  
would authorize the District to levy an  
excess property tax on all taxable  
property within the District beginning with  
the collection in 2015 and continuing  
three consecutive years thereafter to be  
used for maintenance and operations to  
maintain the current level of fire and  
emergency medical services. The levy  
amount for each of the four years would  
be \$75,000 with an approximate rate of  
\$0.55 per \$1,000.00 of assessed  
valuation.

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
