Draw a line through the incorrect candidate name or ballot measure choice. You may then make another choice if you wish. Do not use white-out or erase.

Accessible Voting Equipment is available at the Election Office, 400 N Main St, Coupeville, 18 days prior to Election Day from 9:00 am until 4:00 pm; on Election Day from 9:00 am to 8:00 pm.

Place your voted ballot in the pink security envelope, seal and place the pink security envelope in the colored return envelope, seal that envelope, sign and date the declaration.

Sign and date the Voter's Declaration on the return envelope. If you are unable to sign, make your mark, have it witnessed by two (2) other people and make sure they both sign the envelope. A Power of Attorney is not allowed for any voting purpose.

Contact Island County Elections at (360) 679-7366 or by email at [elections@co.island.wa.us](mailto:elections@co.island.wa.us) to request a new ballot if your current ballot is lost, destroyed or spoiled.

If returning your ballot by mail, affix First Class Postage on the return envelope. If you deposit your ballot in a ballot drop box, no postage is required. **Your ballot must be postmarked no later than Election Day.** Ballots with a late postmark will not be counted.

**Stanwood-Camano School District #401, Proposition No. 1, Educational Maintenance and Operations Levy**

The Board of Directors of Stanwood-Camano School District No. 401 passed Resolution #2015/16-001 concerning a proposition to support school programs and daily operations. This proposition authorizes the District to levy the following excess taxes, to replace an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, to maintain current educational program funding and support the District's General Fund program and daily operations expenses, including textbooks, classroom materials, and staff:

**South Whidbey School District #206, Proposition No. 1, Replacement Maintenance and Operation Levy**

The Board of Directors of South Whidbey School District No. 206 adopted Resolution No. 619 concerning a proposition to finance maintenance and operation expenses. If approved, this proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess property taxes, to follow an expiring levy, upon all taxable property within the District, for support of the District's General Fund educational maintenance and operation expenses:
