Important Voting Instructions - Please use black ink and vote for only one candidate in each race.

Completely BLACKEN the oval beside the name of your choice, like this ●.

If you wish to vote for a candidate not printed on the ballot, write the name of the candidate in the space provided and blacken the oval next to the write-in line.

If you make a mistake: Draw a line through the entire candidate's name like this: ~~● George Washington~~. You then have the option of making another choice.

Unless specifically allowed by law, more than one vote for an office or ballot measure will be an overvote and no votes for that office or ballot measure will be counted.

If a primary election was held for an office, the two candidates who received the most votes in the Primary advanced to the General Election.
