The Board of Directors of Port Townsend School District No. 50 adopted Resolution No. 08-07 concerning a proposition to finance construction and improvement of school facilities. This proposition would authorize the District to construct a new elementary school, make health and safety improvements at Port Townsend High School and Blue Heron Middle School, acquire and install a new District-wide communication system, upgrade the transportation facility, and plan future high school improvements; issue no more than \$35,602,587 of general obligation bonds maturing within 17 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 08-07. This proposition would authorize the District to construct and equip an addition at Forks High School to replace existing buildings not rehabilitated in 1999-2000 that will include classrooms, labs, library/media center, music room, multipurpose PE/athletic facility, support services space and other capital improvements; issue no more than \$11,500,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 23 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 11-07/08. The Board of Directors of Quillayute Valley School District No. 402 adopted Resolution No. 11-07/08, concerning a proposition to finance a new stadium and multipurpose field. This proposition would authorize the District, only if Proposition 1 is approved, to construct and equip a new Forks High School Stadium and synthetic turf multipurpose field; issue no more than \$4,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 23 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 11-07/08.
