Please affix first class postage (\$0.49) or if you choose not to mail your ballot you may deliver it to: Lincoln County Auditor's Office, Lincoln County Courthouse, 450 Logan, Davenport or one of the designated drop boxes before 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. INITIATIVE TO THE PEOPLE

INITIATIVE MEASURE NO. 1351

Initiative Measure No. 1351 concerns K-12 education. This measure would direct the legislature to allocate funds to reduce class sizes and increase staffing support for students in all K-12 grades, with additional class-size reductions and staffing increases in high-poverty schools. INITIATIVE MEASURE NO. 591

Initiative Measure No. 591 concerns firearms. This measure would prohibit government agencies from confiscating guns or other firearms from citizens without due process, or from requiring background checks on firearm recipients unless a uniform national standard is required. 


How to vote
