
How to vote

Fire Protection District No. 3

Emergency Medical Services Regular Property Levy

The Board of Commissioners for Mason County Fire Protection District No. 3 adopted Resolution No. 2010-06 which includes a proposition to authorize a regular property tax levy for the provision of emergency medical services pursuant to RCW 84.52.069 in the amount of \$0.18 per \$1000.00 of assessed valuation for each of six consecutive years beginning with levy year 2011 for collection in 2012.

The Board of Directors of Pioneer School District No. 402 adopted Resolution No. 11-2010, concerning a proposition to finance maintenance and operations expenses. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District:

Shelton School District No. 309

Educational Programs and Operations Replacement Levy
Proposition No. 1

The Board of Directors of Shelton School District No. 309 adopted Resolution No. 10-10, concerning a proposition to finance educational programs and operation expenses. This proposition would authorize the District to support educational programs and operations, technology, transportation, maintenance and operations, by levying the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District:

Pioneer School District No. 402

General Obligation Bonds -- \$24,500,000
Proposition No. 2

The Board of Directors of Pioneer School District No. 402 adopted Resolution No. 12-2010, concerning a proposition to finance expansion and construction of schools. This proposition would authorize the District to expand Pioneer Primary School to accommodate Grades K-5 and make safety, health, parking and playground improvements, to construct and equip a new middle school (Grades 6-8) to replace Pioneer Intermediate/Middle School, to issue no more than \$24,500,000 of general obligation bonds maturing with a maximum term of twenty (20) years, and to levy excess property taxes annually to repay the bonds.
