Proposition No. 2
 EMS Property Tax Levy Adjustment

The Board of Commissioners of Mason County Fire Protection District No. 8 adopted Resolution No. 09-03 concerning a proposition to finance emergency medical services and continue paramedic services. This proposition would authorize the board of commissioners of the district to increase the existing emergency medical services property tax levy to an amount not to exceed \$0.50 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation for the remaining four years of the levy beginning in 2009 for collection beginning in 2010.

Proposition No. 1
 EMS Regular Property Tax Levy

Shall Mason County Fire Protection District No. 5 be authorized to levy a regular property tax in the sum of \$0.25 (maximum) per \$1,000.00 assessed valuation each year for six consecutive years beginning in 2010 to be collected for the continued provision of Emergency Medical Services as provided in Mason County Fire Protection District No. 5 Resolution No. 305 and the laws of the State of Washington RCW 84.52.069.

Fire Protection District No. 8

Proposition No. 1
 Levy Lid Lift

The Mason County Fire District No. 8 Board of Commissioners adopted Resolution No. 09-02 concerning a proposition to finance increased staffing and service levels. This measure would increase the District's regular tax levy to an amount not to exceed \$.83 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation in 2009 for collection in 2010. The maximum allowable levy in 2009 shall serve as the base for computing subsequent levy limitations as provided by chapter 84.55 RCW.
