SKAMANIA COUNTY METROPOLITAN PARK DISTRICT - CREATION
 SPECIAL ELECTION - PROPOSITION #1
 AUTHORIZING THE CREATION OF THE SKAMANIA COUNTY METROPOLITAN PARK DISTRICT

The Skamania County Board of Commissioners adopted resolution 2014-55 and the Stevenson City Council adopted resolution 2014-272 concerning a proposition to form the Skamania County Metropolitan Park District. If approved, this proposition will create said district pursuant to RCW 35.61, with statutory powers, including to levy annually, a general tax on all property in the district not to exceed \$.75 per \$1000 of assessed valuation, for the operation and maintenance of the Stevenson pool. The boundaries of which will encompass land lying within the boundaries of the Stevenson-Carson school district No. 303, excluding any portion of land within the boundaries of the City of North Bonneville, Skamania County.
