



Instructions

Marking Your Ballot



Completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice.
Use a dark pen. Do not use pencil.
Unless specifically allowed by law, more than one vote for an office or ballot measure will be an overvote and no votes for that office or ballot measure will be counted. To vote for a candidate whose name is not printed on the ballot, write the candidates name on the line provided and fill in the oval.

Correcting Your Ballot



If you make a correction, draw a line through the entire response. You then have the option of making another choice if you wish.
In order for your ballot to be counted, it must be either postmarked or deposited at a designated deposit site no later than 8:00 P.M on Election Day (August 16). A list of Ballot Drop Box locations may be found at www.spokanecounty.org/elections.

Proposed Amendment to City Charter
Regarding Qualifications of Elective Officials

This proposition will amend Section 6 of the Spokane City Charter to provide that the offices of mayor, council president or council member are separate elected positions each with separate term of office and term limitation and to define "residency" for purpose of holding elected office, as set forth in Ordinance No. C34622.

Proposed Amendment to City Charter
Regarding Salary of Elected Officials

This proposition will amend Section 7 of the Spokane City Charter to provide that the salary of the mayor shall be equal to the salary of the highest paid city employee, other than the city administrator, and the salaries of the council president or council member shall be established by ordinance adopted by the City Council or pursuant to state law, as set forth in Ordinance No. C34623.
