IF YOU MAKE A MISTAKE Draw a line through the candidate's entire name: ~~George Washington~~. You then have the option of making another choice if you wish. The instructions on the security envelope may also be used to change your vote to another choice.

Unless specifically allowed by law, more than one vote for an office or ballot measure will be an overvote and no votes for that office or ballot measure will be counted. In order for your ballot to be counted, it must be either postmarked or deposited at a designated deposit site no later than 8:00 P.M. on election day.

INITIATIVE MEASURE NO. 985

Initiative Measure No. 985 concerns transportation. This measure would open high-occupancy vehicle lanes to all traffic during specified hours, require traffic light synchronization, increase roadside assistance funding, and dedicate certain taxes, fines, tolls and other revenues to traffic-flow purposes.
