This bill would expand the rights, responsibilities, and obligations accorded state-registered same-sex and senior domestic partners to be equivalent to those of married spouses, except that a domestic partnership is not a marriage.

General Obligation Bonds - \$5,000,000

The Cheney City Council adopted Ordinance No. V-15 which requests the voters authorize bonds to construct and equip phase I of the 50 acre park to include replacing the damaged Wren Pierson Community Center. If approved the City will issue \$5,000,000 of general obligation bonds with a maximum term of 20 years and levy property taxes annually in excess of regular property tax levies to repay such bonds, as provided in Ordinance No. V-15.

Fire Protection Service Excess Levy

The Spangle Town Council enacted ordinance No. 389 concerning a proposition to finance the 2010 fire protection services. This proposition would authorize the City to levy an excess property tax on all taxable property within the Town of Spangle in an approximate rate of \$1.50 per \$1,000 of 2009 assessed value to raise \$23,000 to be collected and used to provide adequate fire protection services in 2010.

General Obligation Fire Bonds - \$33,000,000
(Fire Department Improvements)

The Mayor recommended and the City Council of the City of Spokane, Washington, passed Ordinance No. C-34464, concerning a proposition to finance Fire Department improvements. This proposition would authorize the City to acquire new and improve existing firefighting and lifesaving apparatus, vehicles and equipment, construct new and renovate existing fire stations and facilities, modernize Fire Department technology and data/communication systems and equipment, and acquire land for future fire stations and facilities; issue no more than \$33,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 11 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Ordinance No. C-34464.

Proposed Amendment to City Charter Adding a Bill of Rights

This proposition will amend the City Charter, as set forth in Initiative No. 2009 - 2, to add a Community Bill of Rights which includes provisions related to a locally-based economy, affordable preventive healthcare, affordable housing, affordable and renewable energy, protection of the natural environment, the right of neighborhood residents to decide certain land use issues, prevailing wages and apprenticeships for workers on certain construction projects, and employer neutrality and constitutional rights in the workplace.
