To vote for a candidate whose name is not printed on the ballot, write the candidate's name on the line provided and fill in the oval next to the line.

You then have the option of making another choice if you wish.

Unless specifically allowed by law, more than one vote for an office or ballot measure will be an overvote and no votes for that office or ballot measure will be counted.

In order for your ballot to be counted, it must be either postmarked or deposited at a designated deposit site no later than 8:00 P.M. on Election Day. A list of deposit sites may be found at www.spokanecounty.org/elections.

READ: Each candidate for partisan office may state a political party that he or she prefers. A candidate's preference does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party, or that the party approves of or associates with that candidate.

The Rockford Town Council enacted Ordinance No. 10-06R concerning a proposition to finance emergency medical services. This proposition would authorize the Town to levy regular property tax in 2010 in the sum of \$.50 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation each year for six consecutive years, collection to begin in 2011 for the provision of emergency medical services. Levy for Library Operations and Maintenance

The Spokane County Library District Board of Trustees adopted Resolution No. 10-02 concerning a proposition to authorize a regular property tax. To provide continued funding for normal operation and maintenance of the ten community libraries, this proposition would authorize the district to restore its regular property tax levy rate to \$0.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value in 2010 for collection in 2011, as allowed by chapter 84.55 RCW. Thereafter, such levy amount would be used to compute limitations for subsequent year levies as allowed by Chapter 84.55 RCW. Should this proposition be:

Fire Protection District No. 9

Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 9
Replacement Maintenance and Operation Levy

The Board of Commissioners of Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 9 adopted Resolution No. 10-4 concerning a proposition to meet the District's maintenance and operation needs. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following taxes, in place of an existing levy, upon all taxable property within the District, for support of the District's Expense Fund expenditures for maintenance, operations and emergency medical services as follows: Levy in 2010 for collection in 2011, a levy rate of approximately \$1.60 per \$1,000 of assessed value, to provide a levy amount of \$6,376,200; and, levy 2011 for collection in 2012, a levy rate of approximately \$1.60 per \$1,000 of assessed value, to provide a levy amount of \$6,754,000.
