
Marking Your Ballot



Completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice.
Use a dark pen. Do not use pencil.

Unless specifically allowed by law, more than one vote for a ballot measure will be an over vote and no votes for that office or ballot measure will be counted.

Correcting Your Ballot



If you make a correction, draw a line through the entire response. You then have the option of making another choice if you wish.

In order for your ballot to be counted, it must be either postmarked or deposited at a designated deposit site no later than 8:00 P.M on election day. A list of deposit sites may be found at www.spokanecounty.org/elections.

Replacement Maintenance, Operations and Non-High Support Levy

The Board of Directors of Orchard Prairie School District No. 123 adopted Resolution No. 10-01 concerning a proposition to finance maintenance and operation expenses and Non-High School support. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, upon all taxable property within the District, for support of the District's educational maintenance and operation expenses and Non-High School support services

Proposition No. 1
East Valley School District No. 361
Bonds To Renovate Schools

The Board of Directors of East Valley School District No. 361 adopted Resolution No. 2699 concerning renovation of schools to improve learning, safety and operating efficiencies. This proposition would authorize the District to renovate and improve Trentwood, East Farms, Otis Orchards, Skyview and Trent Elementary Schools, make District-wide infrastructure upgrades for instructional technology, create an Enrichment Center, and improve East Valley Middle School to accommodate support services; issue no more than \$33,750,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 25 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 2699.
