


Spokane County, Washington  
Levy to Replace the Spokane Regional Animal Protection Shelter**

The Board of Spokane County Commissioners adopted Resolution No. 2011-0679, concerning a proposition to replace the Spokane Regional Animal Protection Shelter. This proposition would increase the regular property tax levy up to 5.8 cents per \$1,000 of assessed valuation in 2012 and automatically terminate within 9 years or less unless reauthorized by public vote, be used exclusively to replace the regional animal protection shelter, result in a total authorized regular property tax levy rate of up to \$1.298 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for collection in 2012 and adjust the levy thereafter as allowed by chapter 84.55 RCW.
