
#### How to vote

#### Proposition No. 1 Veteran's Memorial Swimming Pool General Obligation Bonds Principal Amount of \$5,830,000

The City Council of the City of Walla Walla adopted Ordinance No. 2014-47 concerning a proposition to rebuild the Veteran's Memorial Swimming Pool. This proposition would authorize the City to rebuild the Veteran's Memorial Swimming Pool and construct a new family pool and related facilities; issue \$5,830,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years; and levy annual excess property tax levies to pay such bonds, as provided in Ordinance No. 2014-47. #### Proposition 1 Replacement of Expiring Maintenance and Operation Levy

The Board of Directors of Columbia School District No. 400 adopted Resolution No. 1415-01, concerning a proposition to finance maintenance and operation expenses. This proposition would authorize the District to meet the educational needs of its students by levying the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, upon all taxable property within the District, for support of the District's General Fund maintenance and operation expenses:

#### Proposition 2 Replacement of Expiring Capital Levy for Technology Improvements

The Board of Directors of Columbia School District No. 400 adopted Resolution No. 1415-02, concerning a proposition to finance technology improvements. This proposition would authorize the District to: acquire and install technology and communication equipment and make other technology improvements and upgrades to enhance student learning; and levy the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, upon all taxable property within the District:
